Site visit and station location analysis

Members of the Administrative Unit of the AQF (Ricardo Aragon, Cesar Fierro and Sergio Vasquez), the Mexican co-president (Ing. Oscar Fentanes), and researchers from the Autonomous University of Ciudad Juarez visited four proposed sites on March 23, 2022, for the installation of a new air quality monitoring station in Ciudad Juarez. The sites were first categorized by their location with respect to the current urban growth, population density and availability of services (electricity, security, internet, etc.) O

Following the visit, they conducted an analysis on their findings, which was presented to the Fund Committee as a report titled *Report on visit to four proposed sites in Ciudad Juarez Summary*.
