Air Monitoring Network in Juarez

- TCEQ requested and was awarded by EPA funds to continue to collaborate with Ciudad Juarez.
- 2019- Ciudad Juarez led the upgrade of gas calibrators and zero air generators at their sites
- Would like to propose for the technical committee to work with Ciudad Juárez and come up with some recommendations on the next upgrades




Upper Air Studies in El Paso del Norte

- Using innovative monitoring techniques
 - to assess the composition of particulate matter generated by wild fires.
- Continue ceilometer operations
 - develop a public domain website to host historic and future ceilometer data.
- Mesoscale and synoptic scale meteorological influences on ozone.
- This innovative projects directly supports efforts to understand the importance of the Mixing Layer Heights (MLH).
